- Director Ms. Karen Garcia is on vacation the week of 12/18-12/22 together with the school closure week from 12/23-1/1/24. She will not attend the December Vestry meeting.
- On 12/13/23 Community Care Licensing came on campus to report to us and close the active
 investigation they had. The initial reason they came to follow up on a complaint was unsubstantiated.
 However in the course of their investigation they found several Type B violations which are of a minor
 nature and have to do with reporting or other documentation issues. We were given a plan of correction
 which has already been completed.
- Tours of the preschool continue and we have 3 pending enrollments of younger siblings of current students along with new potential enrollments of 2 year olds for after the New Year.

Fiscal Update:

• November's P & L shows a small positive net income of \$1,103.36 for the preschool.

Other Updates:

- The Preschool Action Plan Team will meet again in January 2024 to continue work on our action plan.
- On 12/15/23 the preschool children made Christmas ornaments with the help of participants of the senior program. The star ornaments will decorate the forest of trees in the sanctuary.
- For 2024 the preschool would like to have a St. David's Day Festival as a fundraiser as we did prior to the pandemic. It is preferred that the Festival be held Saturday, March 2, 2024.

St. David's Service & Justice Committee meeting of Tues. Nov. 28, 2023

Members present: Debby Park, Joy Wolf, Roseann Myers, Deacon Nancy Holland

Debby opened with a Blessing for the Community and a scripture reflection from 2 Corinthians v.9

- 1. CCSA Family Christmas Basket and Gift Bag programs: Roseann explained the importance of our support of these programs as a founding member of CCSA and in celebration of their 50th Anniversary. There will be a separate announcement going out on Thursday devoted entirely to this and the DOK Calendar project. This information will also be in the Weekly Times, bulletins and December Gospel.
- 2. Farmworkers' Children's Gift program: Deacon Nancy received this information from Robert Vivar, Diocesan Migration Missioner. People can sign up to choose from a list with gender & age of children and provide a gift. Nancy has offered to take the gifts to the Diocesan office. We decided it was OK to provide this information to the congregation. Some people really like the idea of buying a gift!
- **3. ECS Annual Recovery Thanksgiving Lunch:** This was a big success at St. Mark's in City Heights on Nov. 16 with food donated by many churches (St. David's provided some appetizers), volunteers from many churches to set up and serve, and students from the Bishop's School. Five people from St. David's volunteered. We honored and got to visit with the clients and staff from the ECS CERRC substance abuse recovery program.
- **4. Bay Park Holiday Food Drive:** 8 parishioners helped prepare the food bags on Nov. 15. Bags were distributed to our congregation after church on Nov. 26, and other volunteers passed out bags throughout the neighborhood Nov. 26-28. This Saturday is the Food Drive when volunteers will collect the bags from neighbors and bring them to our parking lot where volunteers (we hope to have many parishioners helping) will sort the food donations into bins provided by San Diego Food Bank the recipient of all the food.
- 5. Thanksgiving for seniors who don't have family: Debby learned of only two people who needed an invitation (there might have been more) and asked Christ Timmins to ask DOK members if they could help. She knows that Anne K invited Mercedes to breakfast after the service on Thanksgiving Day (and Mercedes mentioned to Debby tonight at choir how much she appreciated and enjoyed that!) Next year we could start asking in October for possible hosts and recipients.
- **6. Christmas cards for County Mental Health patients:** This is a tradition. Debby asks parishioners to sign Christmas cards at Coffee Hour on the Sunday that she does the Evening prayer service at the psychiatric hospital. This year it will be on Dec. 17, and she will give the cards to the patients who come for the service.

- 7. Sacred Ground: Joy reported that the current Circle will finish the curriculum soon. She hopes to have enough people to start a new Circle in January. The Sacred Ground Action Group will help with the Bay Park Food Drive on Saturday. The Bayard Rustin documentary was mentioned as a possible video to watch in 2024.
- **8. Draft Service & Justice Calendar for 2024:** We discussed possible Service & Justice activities/projects for the coming year and came up with a first draft (see attached). It will be a work in progress.
- 9. Next meeting: Tues. Jan. 23 at 11 am on Zoom (We will not meet in December.)
